Gives you a voice. The volunteer committee represents the approximately 3,721,000 New Yorkers living in the Empire State's more than 14,400 community associations. Your donation saves you and your community association money by protecting New York's homeowner and condominium associations from burdensome legislation.

Keeps you informed and involved. The New York Legislative Action Committee (LAC) organizes "grassroots" advocacy campaigns — letters, e-mails, phone, and social media communications regarding important issues related to community associations.

Tracks legislation that could impact community associations. In 2024, the committee reviewed 361 bills that directly or indirectly impacted community associations >> www.caionline.org/LegislativeTracking

Strengthens key relationships with lawmakers. By educating lawmakers, legislative and executive staff, and other organizations, as well as testifying, the committee helps advance issues facing community associations and influence the outcome of legislation.

Advocacy Successes. New York's state legislature began on January 3 and adjourned on June 6, 2024. Below are highlights from the 2024 half of the New York State Legislature:

S 9027 Requires the installation and maintenance of outdoor lithium-ion battery charging stations at multiple dwellings Requires the installation and maintenance of outdoor lithium-ion battery charging stations at multiple dwellings as part of the state uniform fire prevention and building code; prohibits charging lithium-ion batteries used in powered mobility devices inside of multiple dwellings. The LAC opposed this bill, as it does not align with CAI's Electric Vehicle Charging Stations Public Policy as it requires the installation of a charging station.

Status: Successfully DIED in Committee.

A 6615/S 6242 Creates the office of the cooperative and condominium ombudsperson and authorizes the residential unit fee This bill created a condominium and cooperative ombudsman office to be housed within the attorney general's office, and in addition to education programs, the ombudsman would have the power to mediate disputes. The bill also establishes an annual fee of \$6 to be paid by condominium and cooperative associations. The LAC opposed this bill due to its conflict with CAI's Alternative Dispute **Resolution Public Policy.**

Status: Successfully DIED in Committee
