

## FREE Corporate Transparency Act Resources for HOA/Condo Boards

The Corporate Transparency Act is a federal law enacted to combat money laundering, terrorist financing, and other illicit activities. It requires beneficial owners of corporations, limited liability companies, and similar entities to disclose information about ownership to the Department of Treasury's Financial Crimes Enforcement Network. This information includes each beneficial owner's full legal name, date of birth, current residential or business street address, and a unique identifying number from an acceptable identification document or a FinCEN identifier (i.e., current U.S. passport, U.S. ID, driver's license, etc.).

The U.S. Department of Treasury determined most community associations (homeowners associations, condominiums, and housing cooperatives), if incorporated and not meeting the exemptions, are required to comply with the act. For existing community associations, the deadline to comply with these reporting requirements is Jan. 1, 2025.

Community associations are typically nonprofit organizations, unincorporated communities, trusts, or business corporations that govern residential communities. They are governed by volunteer boards comprised of homeowners. Volunteer boards are responsible for all operations and ensure the association is following the law and community governing documents, including the act.
