Your donation saves you and your community association money by protecting Connecticut's homeowner and condominium associations from burdensome legislation.

Keeps you informed and involved. The Connecticut Legislative Action Committee (CTLAC) organizes "grassroots" advocacy campaigns — letters, e-mails, phone, and social media communications regarding important issues related to community associations.

Tracks legislation that could impact community associations. In 2024, the committee reviewed 9 bills that directly or indirectly impacted community associations >> www.caionline.org/LegislativeTracking

Strengthens key relationships with lawmakers. By educating lawmakers, legislative and executive staff, and other organizations, as well as testifying, the committee helps advance issues facing community associations and influence the outcome of legislation.

Advocacy Successes. During the 2024 state legislative session. CAI CTLAC worked tirelessly to navigate through many bills, and we are proud of the result which includes the following.

SB 144 AN ACT CONCERNING RESERVE FUNDS IN COMMON INTEREST OWNERSHIP

COMMUNITIES. This bill requires that no later January 1, 2025, and to repeated annually, association boards shall conduct a study of reserve funds, determine the amount of funds necessary to maintain an adequate level of reserves and make recommendations concerning the allocation of funds necessary to maintain an adequate level. **The LAC opposed this bill**, as it contained language with did not align with CAI's Reserve Study and Funding Public Policy. The LAC is working with legislators to introduce a new reserve study mandate bill next legislative session that better aligns with CAI's public policy language.

Status: Successfully DIED in Committee.

HB 5152 AN ACT CONCERNING RENTERS IN COMMON INTEREST OWNERSHIP

COMMUNITIES. This bill would prohibit associations from implementing rules and regulations which effectively prohibit the renting of less than 50% of units within a community. The LAC opposed this bill.

Status: Successfully DIED in Committee.
