IMPORTANT NOTE: The final deadline for submitting Right of Entry Forms is *Monday, March 31st*. A Right of Entry form gives government contractors permission to access your property and begin the debris removal process, including all fire-damaged debris. Homeowners can also opt out of the program, and coordinate their own debris removal. Los Angeles County has the following to say about if an entire condominium needs to submit a Right of Entry Form for Community Associations:
