Gives you a voice. The volunteer committee represents the approximately 2,249,000 Arizonans living in more than 10,100 community associations across the Grand Canyon State. Your donation saves you and your community association money by protecting Arizona's homeowner and condominium associations from burdensome legislation.

Keeps you informed and involved. The Arizona Legislative Action Committee organizes "grassroots" advocacy campaigns — letters, e-mails, phone, and social media communications regarding important issues related to community associations.

Tracks legislation that could impact community associations. In 2024, the committee reviewed 33 bills that directly or indirectly impacted community associations >> www.caionline.org/LegislativeTracking

Strengthens key relationships with lawmakers. By educating lawmakers, legislative and executive staff, and other organizations, as well as testifying, the committee helps advance issues facing community associations and influence the outcome of legislation.

Advocacy Successes. During the 2024 state legislative session. CAI AZLAC worked tirelessly to navigate through many bills, and we are proud of the result which includes the following:

SB 1432: UNLAWFUL RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS; UNIFORM ACT Notwithstanding any provision in the governing document or other law, this bill permits the governing body (i.e., a Board of Directors) in a common-interest community to amend governing documents to remove unlawful restrictive covenants without a vote of the owners/members of the common-interest community association. An "unlawful restriction" is a prohibition, restriction, covenant, or condition in a document that interferes with or restricts the transfer, use, or occupancy of real property on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, familial status, or disability in violation of state or federal law. Allows an owner/member to request such an amendment and requires removal of an unlawful restriction within 90 days. The Arizona LAC supported this bill. Status: Successfully PASSED. Signed by Governor Hobbs March 29, 2024. Effective September 14, 2024.

HB 2470: PLANNED COMMUNITIES; AUTHORITY; PUBLIC ROADWAYS Under this bill, planned community associations created before 2015 would no longer be able to regulate parking on public streets, even if their CC&Rs authorized such regulation. The Arizona LAC opposed to this bill and sent out a call to action which saw 1,021 messages sent by 500 advocates to lawmakers. Status: Successfully FAILED in House.
